

BROADLEAF

BUXUS

B. 'Glencoe'

Chicagoland Green

Boxwood

(2-3')grows more rapidly than Green Velvet; compact spreading habit; medium green leaf with a hairline gold edge; beautiful plant; full sun to part shade

B. 'Green Velvet'

Green Velvet Boxwood

(2-3')velvety leaves and dark green color holding through winter; vigorous, retains rounded shape; slow growing and dense; full sun to part shade

B. *microphylla*

Winter Gem Boxwood

(2-2 1/2')dense, bright green foliage maturing to dark green holding through winter; compact, hardy and adaptable; grows quickly; full sun to part shade

B. *microphylla* var. *koreana*

Wintergreen Boxwood

(2-3')bright green foliage becomes coppery colored in winter; upright and spreading habit; superior cultivar; sun or shade

B. *microphylla* var. *koreana*

Green Mountain

Boxwood

(5' x 3')glossy dark green foliage; extremely hardy upright form; can be used in hedges or individually; sun or shade

ILEX

I. *glabra* 'Compacta'

Inkberry Holly

(2-3')improved inkberry; tightly branched, evergreen, slow growing; foliage dark green and lustrous; 1/4" black berries holding through winter; may be used in moist areas

I. *verticillata*

Winterberry Holly

(6-8' x 6-8')oval to rounded shape; deciduous green foliage with a yellow fall color; red fruit persists into winter; need male and female for fruiting; sun or part shade

I. *x meserveae*

Blue Prince Holly

(8-10')one male plant sufficient for pollination of numerous females in 30-40 sq ft area; growth is broadly pyramidal, with glossy, dark bluish-green foliage; male plant has no fruit

I. *x meserveae*

Blue Princess Holly

(8-10')pollination necessary for good fruit set; foliage lustrous dark blue-green, berries bright shiny red, highly decorative and outstanding; area protected from wind is best planting site

PIERIS

P. *japonica*

Japanese Andromeda

(4-5')spreads 3-4'; fabulous array of foliage and flowers; bright red new growth matures to dark green; white blooms in drooping panicles appear late April thru early May; sun to part shade; semi-evergreen

PYRACANTHA

P. *angustifolia*

Pyracantha

(6-7')also called Firethorn; white flower clusters in spring; small dark green foliage turning orange to red in fall; 1-4" bright orange-red berries holding into winter, highly decorative

P. *angustifolia*

Pyracantha Espalier

trellised in the pot for transplanting to wall or fence site

RHODODENDRON

Karen Azalea

(5-6')lavender flower clusters mid-spring; foliage small and lustrous green turning purplish in fall; semi-evergreen, heat tolerant but should be protected from wind

(3-5')deciduous, extremely hardy

shades of pink

light purple

dark rosy pink

Spicy Lights

clear, pure white

Red Red Azalea

(4-5')blooms bright red and abundant; compact form; medium green foliage; deciduous

Rhododendron

(5-6')bright lavender flowers; foliage dark green tinted purple in fall; leaves holding through winter; north side location preferred

YUCCA

Y. *filamentosa*

Adam's Needle

Yucca

(24-30")strong stalks producing spikes of cream white flowers in summer (flower spikes can get to a height of 5-6'); solid green leaves; drought tolerant and prolific in reproduction; outstanding flowers

Bright Edge Yucca

(20" x 24")clump forming; dark green leaves with gold margins; creamy white bell shaped flowers; full sun & well drained soil
