

# SHRUBS

## AESCULUS

*A. parviflora*

### Bottlebrush Buckeye

(10-12' x 8-10') upright, spreading; white flower panicles late June to early July; lobed dark green foliage, elegant in appearance; fall color yellow-green; use in shade or semi-shade; spectacular when older

## AMELANCHIER

*A. alnifolia*

### Regent Serviceberry

(4-6' x 4-8') rounded habit; white flowers in spring; green summer foliage changing from yellow to orange in fall; black fruit is edible and tasty

## ARONIA

*A. arbutifolia*

### Red Chokeberry

(7-9' x 5-8') upright, rounded; small white flowers in spring giving way to tiny bright red fruit; green leaves change to red in fall

*A. melanocarpa*

### Autumn Magic Chokeberry

(4-6') width is similar to height; rounded form; small white flowers in spring, green leaves with a red fall color; black fruit through early winter

*A. melanocarpa* 'Morton'

### Iroquois Beauty Chokeberry

(3-4' x 4-5') upright, compact habit; green leaves & white spring flowers, black berries in summer & wine-red fall color; berries can be eaten or used in cooking



## BERBERIS

*B. thunbergii* 'Bogozami'

### Bonanza Gold Barberry

(18" x 36") rounded, spreading; bright gold foliage with bright red fruit; stays in a compact form; very hardy

*B. thunbergii* 'Bailtwo'

### Burgundy Carousel Barberry

(3' x 4-5') spreading form; burgundy-purple, slightly drooping foliage with thorns; tiny red berries are well liked by birds; sunny, moist well-drained soil

*B. thunbergii* 'Concorde'

### Concorde Barberry

(2' x 3') rounded; dark purple, velvety foliage spring through fall; new growth is red; small amount of red fruit; good plant for dry conditions

*B. thunbergii* 'Kobold'

### Kobold Barberry

(18" x 2-3') mounded, compact habit; new foliage bright green maturing to a darker green; fall color ranges from yellow-green to orange; full sun

*B. thunbergii* var. *atro*.

### Crimson Pygmy Barberry

(18-24" x 3') low mounded shape; deep red leaves with a orange-red fall color; spiny stems; full sun

*B. thunbergii* var. *atro*.

### Rosy Glow Barberry

(3' x 2-3') compact, rounded; new foliage rose-pink, maturing to reddish purple with mottled effect; spiny stems; full sun

## BUDDLEIA

*B. davidii*

### Butterfly Bush

(5-8') most varieties are upright, spreading; fast growing; long flower panicles July to Sept.; avail in various colors; attractive to butterflies

## CALYCANTHUS

*C. floridus*

### Sweetshrub

(4-6' x 6-8') upright, spreading habit; foliage dark green changing to yellow in fall, red-brown flowers have spicy scent; moist, loamy soil & sun to full shade; deer resistant

## CARYOPTERIS

*C. x chandonensis*

### Blue Beard

(2-3' x 2-3') mounded, compact form; silvery-green foliage all season with blue flowers late July until frost; blooms on new growth; cut back in spring; deer resistant

Blue Mist-light blue flowers

## CHAENOMELES

*C. speciosa*

### Flowering Quince

(3-4') height is equal to width; blossoms abundant and showy in spring, flowers begin at base of plant and open upwards to branch tips; sun or part shade

Jet Trails-white flowers

Texas Scarlet-red flowers

## CLETHRA

*C. alnifolia*

### Hummingbird Clethra

(3-5' x 3-4') compact, mounded plant, bottle brush-like fragrant white flowers; deep green leaves changing to pale yellow in fall; prefers partial shade; attracts butterflies

*C. alnifolia*

### Ruby Spice Clethra

(4-6' x 3-4') upright habit; non-fading, fragrant pink flowers; green summer foliage with a yellow fall color; partial shade to full sun

## CORNUS

*C. alba* 'Elegantissima'

### Variegated Dogwood

(6-8' x 4-6') cream margin on grey-green leaves; white star shaped flowers in spring; bright red stems are very showy in winter

*C. racemosa*

### Grey Dogwood

(6-10' x 6-8') creamy white flowers late May to June; grey-green foliage turning maroon in fall; white berries in fall; good for massing and screening

*C. sanguinea* 'Cato'  
pp 19,892

### Arctic Sun Dogwood

(3-4' x 3-4') tiny white flowers in spring; dark green leaves turning golden yellow in fall; noted for its showy yellow winter stems

## CORNUS continued

*C. sericea*

### Alleman's Compact Dogwood

(4-5') height is equal to width; white flowers in spring; fall foliage color is reddish-purple; bluish-white fruit; full sun to part shade

*C. stolonifera* 'Farrow'  
pp 18, 523

### Arctic Fire Dogwood

(3-4') upright habit; small white flowers in spring with dark green foliage; leaves turn reddish-purple in fall; red

*C. stolonifera*

### Bud's Yellow Dogwood

(6-8' x 5-6') rounded form; yellowish white flowers in late spring; medium green foliage sometimes changing to shades of purple-red in fall; disease resistant; bright yellow winter stems

*C. stolonifera*

### Cardinal Dogwood

(8-10') height is equal to width; stems are coral colored through winter; foliage dark green in summer; reddish-purple in fall

*C. stolonifera* 'Bailey'

### Redtwig Dogwood

(8-10') height is equal to width; green leaves turn reddish-purple in fall; white flowers in spring; showy red stems

## COTINUS

*C. coggygria*

### Purple Smokebush

(8-10' x 8-10') large shrub or small tree of upright, spreading habit; a showy purple-pink pubescence along 6-8" panicles gives the effect of a tree surrounded by pinkish smoke June through September; summer color reddish purple; deer resistant

## COTONEASTER

*C. acutifolia*

### Peking Cotoneaster

(6-7') as wide as tall; upright habit; excellent hedging plant; small green foliage with an orange-red fall color; easily maintained

*C. apiculatus*

### Cranberry Cotoneaster

(2-3' x 3-6') tiny, glossy green leaves on wide spreading plant; bronze red or purple fall color; pink flowers in early June; abundant bright red fruit through winter

*C. divaricatus*

### Spreading Cotoneaster

(5-6' x 6-8') spreading, mounded habit; glossy green foliage changing to red in fall; pink flowers and bright red berries

*C. horizontalis*

### Rock Cotoneaster

(2-3') wide spreading, low and dense; horizontal branches create layered effect; glossy green foliage, fall color reddish-purple; tiny bright red fruit

*C. x hessei*

### Hessei Cotoneaster

(1-2') growing 4-6' wide in low mounding form; deep pink flower, dark red long-lasting fruit

## DEUTZIA

*D. gracillis*

### Slender Deutzia

(2-5' x 2-5') white fragrant flowers in spring; low mounding habit; dark green foliage with no appreciable fall color

## EUONYMUS

*E. alatus compacta*

### Compact Burning Bush

(8-9') dense, rounded form; formal in appearance; medium green foliage in summer, fall color brilliant red; corky ridges, or wings, are on stems effective in winter; slow growing; will take part shade, but the fall color is best when in full sun

*E. fortunei*

### Emerald & Gold

#### Euonymus

(18-24") spreading up to 5'; erect branching; dark green with gold margins changing to pink-red with gold in fall; makes a good groundcover; full sun to part shade

*E. fortunei*

### Emerald Gaiety

#### Euonymus

(4-5' x 4-5') spreading habit; dense and evergreen, foliage green with white margins; margins are tinged pink in winter

*E. fortunei*

### Sunspot Euonymus

(3') spreading to 6' at maturity, prostrate form; foliage dark green with small yellow center

## FORSYTHIA

*F. 'Meadowlark'*

### Meadowlark Forsythia

(8-10' x 6-10') developed for flower bud hardiness in northern climates; upright arching habit; bright yellow flowers; full sun; deer resistant

*F. 'New Hampshire Gold'*

## New Hampshire Gold

### Forsythia

(4-5' x 4-5') finely branched, compact and rounded; superior in flower and habit; yellow spring blooms, red-purple fall color

*F. viridissima 'Bronxensis'*

### Dwarf Bronx Forsythia

(24-30") very low growing dwarf form; flat mounded habit; spreading 3-4' wide; yellow blooms in spring; bright green foliage turns bronze in fall; deer resistant

## FOTHERGILLA

*F. gardenii*

### Dwarf Fothergilla

(2-3') fragrant, showy white flowers that look like bottle brushes, bluish-green foliage becoming orange to red in fall; does well in partial shade

## HAMAMELIS

*H. vernalis*

### Vernal Witchhazel

(10-12') upright, rounded form; yellow to red fragrant early spring blooms (February), dark green foliage, fall color golden yellow; sun or shade

*H. virginiana*

### Common Witchhazel

(15' x 12-15') small tree or large shrub; fragrant, yellow flowers in November; fall color excellent yellow; does best in full sun

## HIBISCUS

*H. syriacus*

### Rose-of-Sharon

(8-10' x 6-10') leafs out late in spring; flowers from July to September; fall color nondescript; available in pink, white, purple, red and red/white bi-color; full sun

## HYDRANGEA

*H. anomala* *petiolaris*

### Climbing Hydrangea

(to 60')ability to cover rock piles, structures, fences, ect. with dark green foliage and fragrant, showy white flowers late June; sun or shade; slow to establish; outstanding

*H. arborescens*

### Annabelle Hydrangea

(4-5' x 3-5')rounded; summer flowering, very large pure white flower heads; fast growing; needs moist soil, prefers partial shade

*H. macrophylla*

### All Summer Beauty Hydrangea

(3-5')round flower heads of pink or blue depending on soil type; starts flowering mid-summer; blooms on new wood; dark green foliage;

*H. macrophylla* 'Bailmer'

### Endless Summer Hydrangea

(3-5')as wide as tall; blooms all summer on new and old wood from June til frost; petals are clear pink in alkaline soil, blue in acid soil; part shade or sun; remove spent flowers to encourage rebloom

*H. arborescens* 'PINKALZ'

### Endless Summer Bella Anna Hydrangea

(3' x 3')rounded; magenta-pink flowers bloom on new wood consistently summer thru fall; easy to grow; strong stems;

*H. macrophylla* 'B. Bride'

### Endless Summer Blushing Bride Hydrangea

(3-6')upright, compact habit; pure white flowers mature to a light pink; blooms on new and old wood; green foliage; partial shade & moist soil

*H. macrophylla* 'PIHM-I'  
pp 20,176

### Endless Summer Twist-n-Shout Hydrangea

(3-5')upright, rounded; dark green leaves turn burgundy red in fall; lacy, deep pink centers surrounded by pink or blue blossoms depending on soil; blooms on new & old wood

*H. macrophylla*

### Pink Beauty Hydrangea

(3-4')bright pink flowers and red-tinged leaves; blooms in summer; partial shade and moist soil

*H. paniculata*

### Limelight Hydrangea

(6-8' x 5-7')upright, rounded habit; lime green flowers on new and old wood; flowers turn pink, burgundy and green in fall; sun or part shade

*H. paniculata*

### Pink Diamond Hydrangea

(6-8' x 6-8')upright, rounded habit; large flowers open white and turn bright pink in late summer; best in full sun

*H. paniculata* 'Bulk'

### Quick Fire Hydrangea

(6-8')rounded form; late May to early June white blooms that turn to rich, deep pink by fall; flowers on new & old wood; green foliage sometimes turning reddish-purple in fall; full sun to part shade

*H. paniculata*

### Tardiva Hydrangea

(6-8' x 8-10')white flowers from mid-summer til frost; blooms turn pink mid August; dark green foliage; full sun or part shade

*H. paniculata*

### Unique Hydrangea

(6-10')upright, rounded; flowers late summer with large white blooms; flowers change to pink as they fade

*H. paniculata* 'Renha'  
pp 20,670

### Vanilla Strawberry Hydrangea

(6-7' x 4-5')upright; huge vanilla blooms in mid summer change to pink & mature to strawberry red; held on red stems; First Editions series

*H. quercifolia*

### Oakleaf Hydrangea

(4-6' x 3-5')upright, irregular form; white flowers bloom in mid-summer & turn pink in August; green, red oak shaped foliage changes to reds and purples in fall; sun or shade

## HYPERICUM

*H. frondosum*

### Sunburst Hypericum

(2' x 2-3')mounded form; glossy bluish-green foliage with no appreciable fall color; golden yellow flowers June through October; full sun to part shade; drought tolerant; deer resistant

*H. kalmianum* 'Ames'

### Ames St. Johnswort Hypericum

(2-3')rounded; green leaves with bright yellow flowers July thru August; full sun to part shade; drought tolerant; deer resistant

## ITEA

*I. virginica*

### Henry's Garnet

### Virginia Sweetpire

(3-5' x 4-6')rounded; arching habit; bright green foliage in spring changing to brilliant deep reddish-purple fall color; fragrant white flowers June-July; sun or part shade

*I. virginica* 'Sprich'

### Little Henry

### Virginia Sweetpire

(18-24" x 3')mounded habit; green leaves in spring and summer with a red fall color; fragrant white flowers in spring

## LIGUSTRUM

*L. vulgare*

### Cheyenne Privet

(12-15' x 5-6')upright habit; fast growing hedging plant; white flowers; holds dark green foliage late; no appreciable fall color; withstands heavy pruning

*L. x vicari*

### Golden Vicary Privet

(5-6' x 4-5')compact, vase shaped; bright yellow green foliage keeps best color in full sun; small white flowers in spring

## LONICERA

*L. tatarica*

### Arnold's Red Honeysuckle

(6-8' x 6-10')upright form; dark red, fragrant flowers in May with red berries following thru July; maintains blue-green foliage through fall; sun or part shade

## LONICERA continued

*L. xylosteum*

### Clavey's Dwarf Honeysuckle

(6-8' x 5-6') rounded; yellow fragrant flowers in May; grey-green foliage; red berries in fall; salt tolerant

## PHILADELPHUS

*P. x virginalis*

### Double Mockorange

(6-8' x 5-6') upright, arching; white double flowers late spring, very showy and extremely fragrant; medium green foliage; full sun

*P. x virginalis*

### Dwarf Mockorange

(2-3' x 1-2') upright; same wonderful fragrance and white flowers on a compact plant; dark green foliage; full sun

## PHYSOCARPUS

*P. opulifolius*

pp 16,894

### Center Glow Ninebark

(8-10') upright, rounded; yellow-green foliage matures to bright red; white flowers; full sun; moist, well drain soil

*P. opulifolius*

### Dart's Gold Ninebark

(4-5') compact, rounded; good yellow foliage, attractive leaf shape; white flowers and red fruit; use in full sun for best color

*P. opulifolius 'Monlo'*

pp 11,211

### Diablo Ninebark

(8-10') upright, rounded; deep reddish-purple foliage on arching branches; white flower clusters in spring; withstands alkaline and dry soils; best in full sun

*P. opulifolius 'Seward'*

pp 14,821

### Summer Wine Ninebark

(4-6' x 4-6') dense, compact habit; whitish-pink flowers mid summer; green foliage changing to reddish-purple; full sun

## POTENTILLA

*P. fruticosa*

### Goldfinger Potentilla

(3' x 3-4') compact, mounded form; yellow flowers all summer; dark green foliage through fall; attracts butterflies

*P. fruticosa*

### McKay's White Potentilla

(2-2.5" x 2-3') mounded; single creamy white flowers appear for a long bloom season; med to dark green foliage through fall

## PRUNUS

*P. x cistena*

### Purple Leaf Plum

(6-8' x 5-6') upright, oval; small fragrant pink flowers in spring; reddish-purple foliage spring through fall; full sun; also known as Purple Sandcherry

## RHUS

*R. aromatica*

### Gro-Low Sumac

(24") wide spreading to 6'; low mounding plant useful for massing or on slopes; glossy green foliage and scarlet to orange fall color; yellow fragrant flowers in spring & red fruit

*R. typhina 'Laciniata'*

### Cutleaf Staghorn Sumac

(8-10' x 12-15') airy, open shrub of great naturalizing capability; foliage reminiscent of palm fronds; bright green leaves in summer turn into a fall showpiece of oranges and reds; red berries in fall; drought resistant and very hardy

*R. typhina*

### Tiger Eyes Sumac

(6' x 6') dissected leaves are chartreuse when they open then turn bright yellow; orange to scarlet in fall; full to part sun and moist, well drained soil; full sun guarantees the best foliage color

## RIBES

*R. alpinum*

### Alpine Currant

(3-5' x 5-6') rounded; glossy green foliage; small greenish flowers April-May; sun or shade

*R. alpinum*

### Green Mound Currant

(3-4' x 2-3') compact, rounded form with bright green foliage; useful as low hedge or facer plant; sun or shade

## ROSA

Shrub Roses

(2-4') very hardy, long blooming season; low maintenance roses for groundcover, mass plantings, low hedge; roses perform best in full sun and moist, well drained soil

beautiful bright red, continuous bloom into October; low growing and hardy

### Drift Series

Disease resistant, winter hardy; repeat blooming; cross between groundcover & miniature roses

*S. integra* 'Hakura Nishiki'

### Hakura Nishiki Willow

(4-6'+)width is equal to height; rounded, spreading habit; pink stems and buds open to dappled pink, white and green foliage; leaves turn golden in fall; stems turn coral red in winter

*S. purpurea* 'Nana'

### Dwf Blue Arctic Willow

(3-4' x 3-6')upright, rounded form; blue-green, finely textured foliage; stems turn purplish in winter; tolerates wet soil

## SAMBUCUS

*S. nigra* 'Eva' pp15,575

### Black Lace Elderberry

(8-10' x 8-10')rounded habit; pink buds open to pink & white lacy flowers May to June; finely textured, dark purple foliage; full sun

## SPIRAEA

*S. albiflora*

### Japanese White Spirea

(2')low mounding plant with masses of white flowers late June to July; dark green foliage; sun or light shade

*S. betulifolia* 'Tor'

### Tor Birchleaf Spirea

(2-3' x 2-3)compact, rounded; white blooms May thru June; birch-like dark green leaves change to oranges, reds and purples in fall; full sun

*S. japonica*

### Little Princess Spirea

(2-3')spread 3-4'; foliage small and dense, pink flowers very showy against dark green foliage; light shade acceptable

*S. japonica* pp9,363

### Magic Carpet Spirea

(18")compact habit, approx. 24" wide; green foliage red-tipped, pink summer flowers; fall color rust-orange

*S. japonica*

### Neon Flash Spirea

(3')improved Anthony Waterer (no albino shoots); vivid red flowers, richly colored new growth; spreading habit, fall color deep wine red

*S. japonica*

### Norman Spirea

(2-3')very fine semi-dwarf; upright mounded; mint green foliage, rosy pink flowers and raspberry red fall color

*S. japonica*

### Shirobana Spirea

(2-3')medium green foliage; flowers bloom pink, rose and white on the same plant; low mounding habit

*S. nipponica*

### Snowmound Spirea

(3')dense, dark bluish-green foliage and masses of tiny pure white flowers in late May; sun to part shade

*S. x bumalda*

### Anthony Waterer Spirea

(3-4')new growth emerging reddish-purple; flowers rose pink bloom June-July; fall color dark reddish-purple

*S. x bumalda*

### Froebel Spirea

(3-4')new leaf tips purple on dark green foliage; flowers bright pink, effective May-June; fall color insignificant

*S. x bumalda*

### Goldflame Spirea

(2-3')new growth orange, red and copper; color repeats in fall; pink flowers in summer; best in full sun

*S. x bumalda*

### Goldmound Spirea

(2')spread 3-4'; dense and golden yellow all season; best in full sun; pink flowers June and July; fall color insignificant

*S. x vanhouttei*

### VanHoutte Spirea

(5-6')commonly referred to as 'Bridalwreath'; masses of tiny white flowers on dark green foliage; graceful upright arching habit; fall color orange-red

## STEPHANANDRA

*S. incisa*

### Dwarf Stephanandra

(1-2' x 3-6')mounded; yellow white flowers in June; dense shrub with very attractive leaf shape and dark green foliage; light shade acceptable

## SYRINGA

*S. meyeri* 'Palibin'

### Dwarf Korean Lilac

(5-6' x 5-7')pale violet flowers, blooms at an early age; neat compact form; small round foliage; excellent hedging or group plant

*S. patula*

### Miss Kim Lilac

(6-7' x 5-6')pale lilac blossoms; glossy green foliage turns burgundy in fall; hardy compact form; flowers later than other varieties

*S. persica*

### Persian Lilac

(5-6')abundant pale lilac blossoms late May; more compact than vulgaris varieties

*S. vulgaris*

### Common Purple Lilac

(12-15')much loved purple flowers in abundance mid-May; heavy fragrance; tall variety for hedging, specimen or naturalizing

*S. x 'Josee'*

### Josee Lilac

(4-6' x 4-5')fragrant lavender-pink flowers bloom intermittently until frost; small medium green leaves; full sun and well drained soil

*V. carlesii*

### Koreanspice

#### Viburnum

(8' x 8')upright, rounded; early May flowers pinkish-white and fragrant; good green foliage, deep red color in fall; best in full sun

*V. dentatum* 'Christom'

### Blue Muffin Viburnum

(5-7' x 4-6')compact, rounded; glossy green leaves change to yellow in fall; beautiful white flowers in spring and blue berries in summer; full sun to shade

*V. dentatum* 'Synnesvedt'

### Chicago Lustre

#### Viburnum

(8-10')width is equal to height; upright, rounded habit; white flowers in June; dense, serrated bright green foliage; fall color red-purple; adaptable to wet areas; edible berry in fall

*V. dentatum* 'Morton'

### Northern Burgundy

#### Viburnum

(10-12')as wide as tall; glossy green foliage turning burgundy in fall; creamy white flowers late June; blue-black berries in fall

*V. lantana*

### Mohican Viburnum

(12' x 12')upright, oval; an abundance of creamy white flowers early May; dense, dark green foliage; orange-red fruit; sun to part shade

*V. lentago*

### Nannyberry Viburnum

(20' x 10'+)very hardy; upright growth habit; green foliage turns purple-red in fall; use in shade or sun; blue-black fruit attracts birds

*V. opulus compactum*

### Compact European

#### Cranberry Viburnum

(5-6' x 5-6')spreading habit; white flowers April into May; scarlet fruit lasting through winter

*V. opulus nanum*

### Dwarf European

#### Cranberry Viburnum

(2-3')extremely dense rounded form, no trimming necessary; good green foliage turning red in fall; rarely flowers; sun or part shade

*V. plicatum tomentosum*

### Mariesi Doublefile

#### Viburnum

(8-10')rounded habit; excellent abundance of white blossoms on horizontal branching; dark green foliage tinted red in fall; sun or shade

*V. prunifolium*

### Blackhaw Viburnum

(12-15' x 8-12')rounded habit; white flowers in May; edible pink to black fruit Sept.—Oct.; excellent red fall color; slow growing

*V. trilobum*

### Wentworth American

#### Cranberry Viburnum

(4-6')white spring flowers, scarlet fruit; large lobed foliage turning deep red in fall; dense and rounded compact habit

*V. x burkwoodii*

### Burkwood Viburnum

(8-10')pink buds opening to white fragrant blooms in April; lustrous green foliage becoming wine red in fall; upright, multi-stemmed habit

*V. x carlcephalum*

### Fragrant Viburnum

(6-8')equal spread; pink buds opening to white flowers in spring; very fragrant; foliage reddish-purple in fall

*V. x juddii*

### Juddi Viburnum

(6-8' x 4-6')fragrant light pink flowers in spring; bushy spreading habit; sun or partial shade; reddish-black fruit; commonly used in place of *V. carlessii*

## WEIGELA

*W. florida*

### Carnaval Weigela

(4-5' x 3-5')equal width; blooms red, white and pink all at once; azalea-like flower clusters; dark tinted foliage; use in full sun

### Dark Horse Weigela

(2-3' x 2-3')mounding; bronze foliage with lime green veining; magenta pink flowers; birds and butterflies love it

(3-4' x 4-5')dark pink blooms against dark reddish-green foliage; flowers in abundance May-June and sporadically throughout summer

### Midnight Wine Weigela

(2' x 2')deep pink blooms on metallic purple foliage; very compact plant, smallest of weigelas; use in full sun

### My Monet Weigela

(12-18" x 12-15")compact, mounded habit; purplish-pink flowers with green & white variegated foliage; full sun

(5-6')width equal to height; bright red flowers in profusion May through summer; medium green foliage; upright rounded habit

### Variegated Weigela

(4-6' x 6-8')green and cream variegated foliage on a compact rounded plant; pink flowers May-June continuing sporadically throughout summer

(5-6')equal spread; extremely long blooming; light pink buds open to pure white flowers that continue til frost; medium green foliage; full sun

(to 30')twining vine needs ample support; unbelievable flower; 10-12' long racemes in spring; it takes time to produce those famous blooms, but it's worth the wait
